- 3. Why were there punishments for leaving Jamestown, trading with outsiders, or living with Native Americans?
- 4. What were the "starving times"? Could the English colonists have survived the winter of 1609 without resorting to the extreme measures they did?
- 5. What finally was done that made Jamestown profitable/successful?
- 6. What is Morgan's main thesis/argument? Was it effective, credible or persuasive? Why or why not?

- 1. According to Kupperman, why do Americans prefer "to think of Plymouth colony in New England as our true foundation"?
- 2. What is Kupperman's main thesis/argument?

- 4. What evidence does Kupperman use that disagrees with Morgan? Provide at least 2 examples.
- 5. Which historian—Kupperman or Morgan--made the most effective, credible, or persuasive argument based on the evidence you read?
- 6. What lessons can we learn from the Jamestown settlement? In what ways does the story still matter today?
